## Odyssey's Best: Competitive Sport

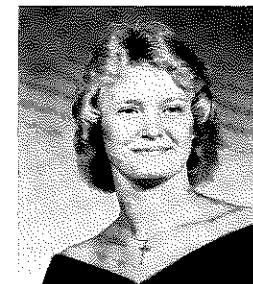

Varsity veteran George Kues saw the basic factor as the singular confrontation that is so much a part of the sport — the battle between pitcher and hitter. "It's a battle in which the participants have to know every possible move."

It is no coincidence that Parkville's position as one of the county's baseball powers came when Coach Butts took over. Knight players were unanimous in their praise for the soft spoken varsity mentor. "He pushes baseball all year and encourages everyone to improve his game," said three year veteran Mike Weglein. 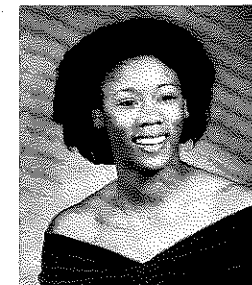

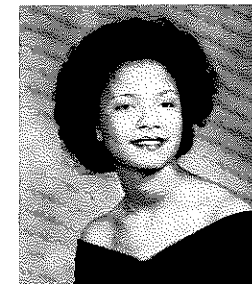
