## Odyssey's Best: Weekend Away

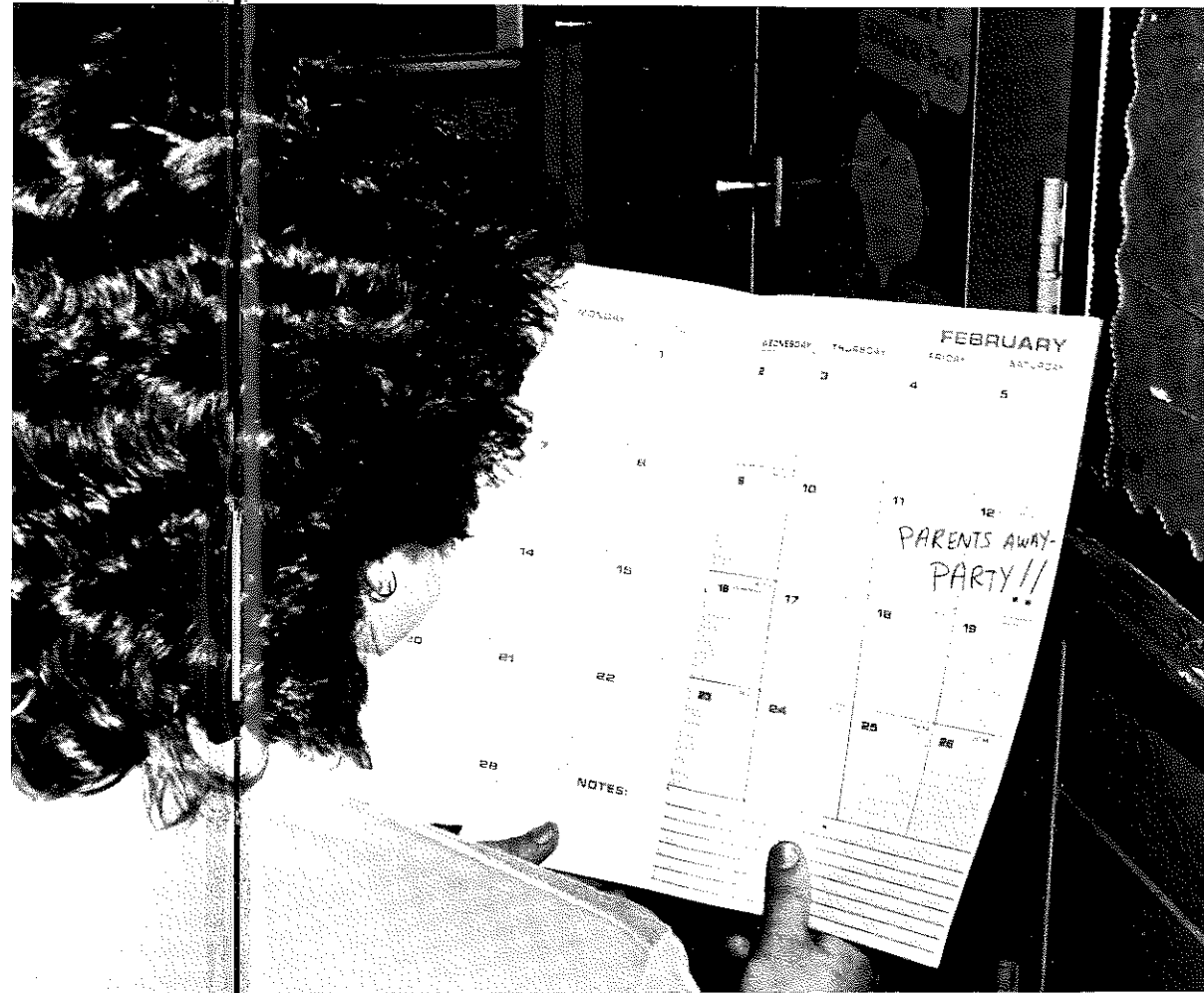

And of course the most

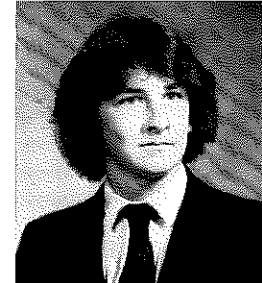
inviting parties are held on this weekend! Be on the lookout for nosy neighbors, especially those out for revenge.

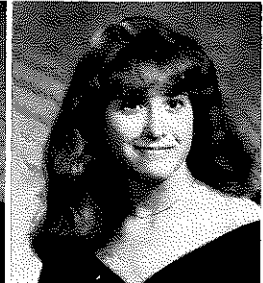
As far as a "worst weekend away", there really isn't any "Getting away from it all" once in a while is a necessity and any place is better than where you'd rather not be."



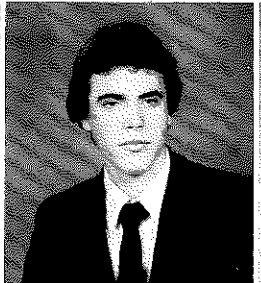
