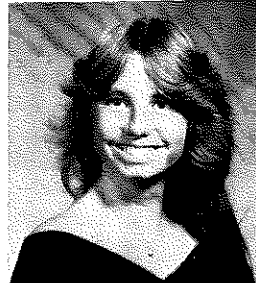

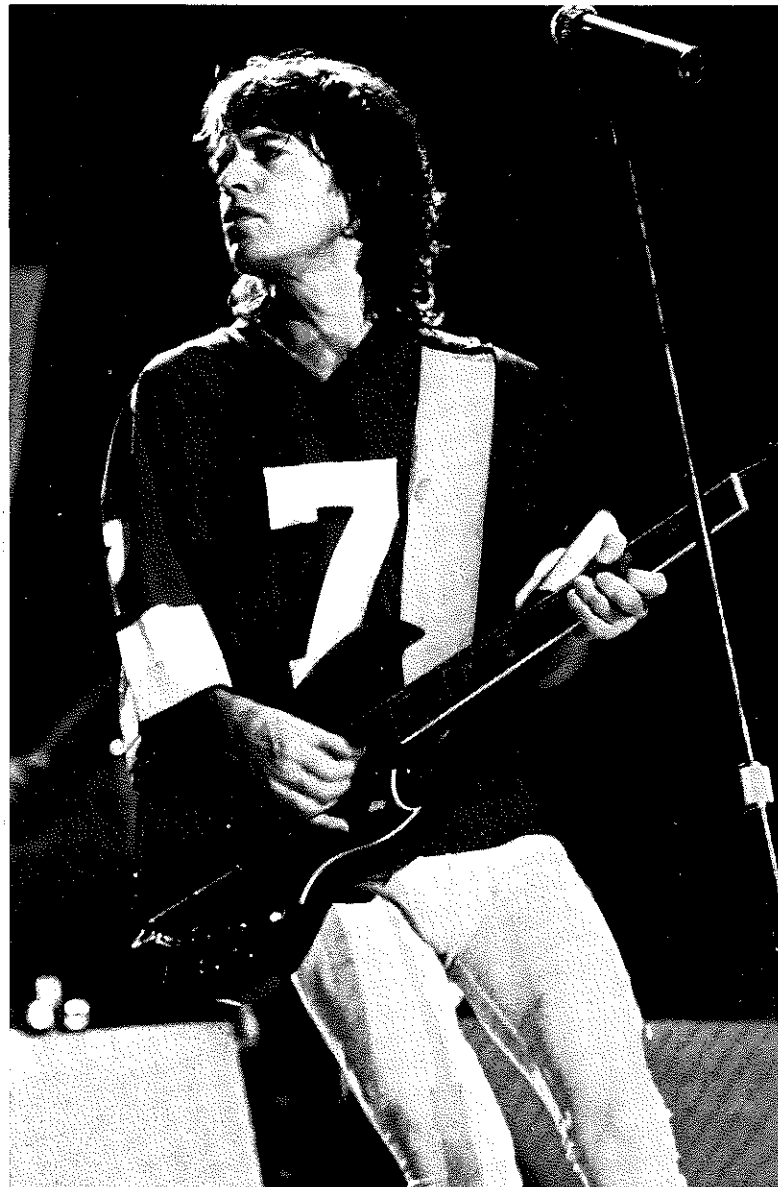
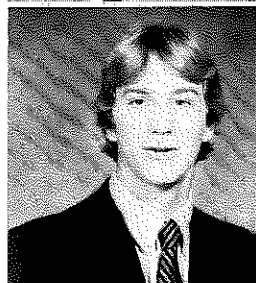

Odyssey's Best: Place to See a Rock Concert

"Tickets for the Judas Priest concert will go on sale Monday." With announcements like this, rock n' roll fans rush to Ticketron or area box offices and often camp outside for days in high hopes of getting the best seats. The three major concert halls in the area are the Capital Centre in Largo, the Civic Center in Baltimore, and Merriweather Post Pavillion in Columbia.

The Capital Centre has the largest seating capacity with close to 18,000 and a fairly decent sound system for a hall that large. The Civic Center seats around

15,000 but has atrocious sound. Both halls feature acts with ticket prices ranging from \$12-15. The Capital Centre also uses an enormous video screen to enhance viewing. Generally, The Civic Center seems to lose most major acts to the Capital Centre.

Outdoor theatres such as Merriweather Post Pavillion hold concerts only in the summer and feature lawn seating but only accommodate about 7,000 people. But its sound system is outstanding and there are few better places to hear top notch rock n' roll than on a summer evening at Merriweather.



Two favorite acts of Parkville students who appeared in area concerts included Judas Priest at left, and Journey who released a new album in February.

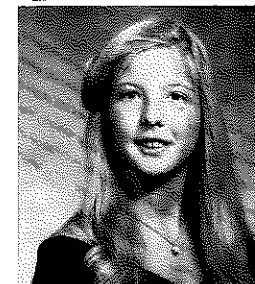
