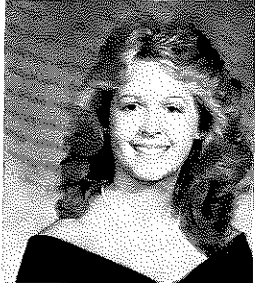

devour their food.

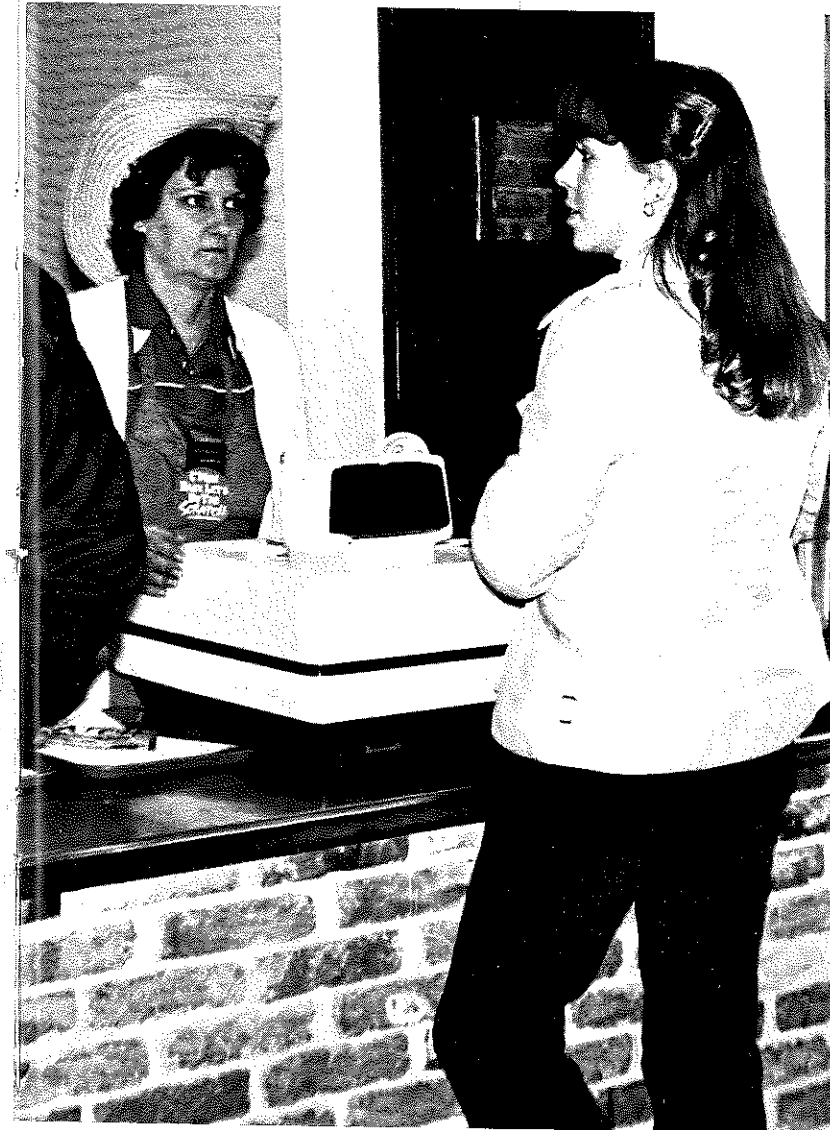
Five area Roy Rogers stops are in

reheated in a microwave.

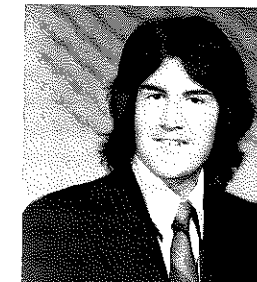
At the bottom of the fast food

service."



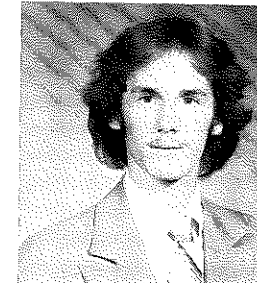
Waiting patiently for the seemingly endless slow service that characterizes Hardee's is senior Kevin Perzan.



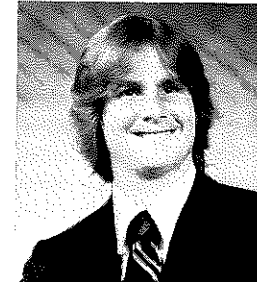
Roy Rogers had such a wide variety of food on its "fast food menu" that senior Tracy Tyler seems unsure of just what she wants.
